REAPPORTIONMENT REFORM

Amends ARTICLE IV, Section 6, Oregon Constitution
(new language in **bold**.)

Section 6. Apportionment of Senators and Representatives. (1) At the regular session of the Legislative Assembly next following an enumeration of the inhabitants by the United States Government, the number of Senators and Representatives shall be fixed by law and apportioned among legislative districts according to population. A senatorial district shall consist of two representative districts.

Apportionment shall be carried out so as to maximize the number of representative districts which can be contained within single counties. The first representative districts drawn shall be those whose boundaries can be confined to one county only. Next, all districts shall be drawn which can be contained within two counties. Subsequent representative districts shall be drawn sequentially, so districts which can be confined to fewer counties will be drawn before districts which will be in more counties.

Any Senator whose term continues through the next regular legislative session after the effective date of the reapportionment shall be specifically assigned to a senatorial district. The ratio of Senators and Representatives, respectively, to population shall be determined by dividing the total population of the state by the number of Senators and by the number of Representatives. A reapportionment by the Legislative Assembly shall become operative no sooner than September 1 of the year of reapportionment.
